Part B. CV SUMMARY (max. 5000 characters, including spaces)

Since I joined the Institute of Philosophy of the Spanish National Research Council (CSIC) in 2001, I have been working on multiple approaches to the ibero-american and political philosophy and philosophy of culture, mainly focused on the 1939 Spanish intellectual exile. I have promoted its awareness, and developed fruitful hypotheses, going beyond Historicism and Hispanism, considering unexplored key concepts such as the relations between Spanish intellectual exile and critical thinking, or the contributions of these



Iberoamerican philosophers to the current debates in contemporary philosophy. Due to these researches, the Iberoamerican philosophy and the 1939 Spanish intellectual exile, have experimented a notorious exposure and visibility nationally and internationally. The results of my work can be found in more than 200 articles, many of them published in prominent and prestigious publications, as in high-impact academic journals (such as *Daimon*, *Pensamiento*, *History of European Ideas*, *Isegoria*, *Arbor* or *Hispanic Research Journal*).

I am also the author of more than 200 contributions to scientific seminars, conventions and conferences, participating in the organization and coordination of a large number of activities, while being part of numerous international organization committees. In the last decade, I have also contributed to knowledge creation as Principal Investigator (PI) of five projects (related to the 1939 Spanish intellectual exile), all of them which went into public I+D+I competitive concurrence. Three of them were financed by the Spanish government, and two of them by the CSIC.

I have also been a researcher of the project WORLDBRIDGES, financed by the European Commission, 7th Framework Programme on Research. In 2019, I was promoted as researcher of the Framework partnership agreement between the CSIC and the Benemérita Universidad Autónoma de Puebla (BUAP). I was also member of the scientific committee of the Inter-ministerial commission for the Spanish government at the 80th anniversary of Republican exile, and was recognized by the Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México (UNAM) with the “2019 National School of High Studies Award” (annual recognition for relevant contributions in the Humanities field). I am currently Merkator Fellow of the Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft (DFG) in the Bergische Universität Wuppertal.

From 2013 to 2019 I was the vice-director of the Institute of Philosophy (IFS, CSIC) and I currently operate as Principal Investigator of the “Social and political Philosophy” group, rated “A” (or excellent) in the internal evaluation of the CSIC, president of the Asociación de Hispanismo Filosófico, president of the Red Internacional de Estudios sobre el Exilio Filosófico e Intelectual Español” and board member of the Red Iberoamericana de Filosofía.

I developed my PhD at the “Instituto de Investigación sobre Liberalismo, Krausismo y Masonería” of the Universidad Pontificia Comillas (Madrid), awarded with a FPU scholarship of the Spanish Ministry of Education and Science (1993-1996). My doctorate was also partially pursued at the Free University of Brussels (1995-1996). I was a postdoctoral fellow at the Mexican Foreign Affairs Secretary (2001), Comunidad Autónoma de Madrid (2001-2004), Fundación Caja Madrid (2006), Fundación Carolina (2006) and Deutscher Akademischer Austauschdienst (2005-2006). All these research fellowships allowed me to become a visiting researcher at the Université Libre de Bruxelles, Freie Universität Berlin, Ibero-Amerikanisches Institut (Berlín), UNAM, El Colegio de México y Pontificia Universidad Javeriana de Bogotá.

Many of my publications are oriented to share and communicate extensively, which I have done numerous times by participating at events for large audiences. I coordinated some activities in renowned forums as Instituto Cervantes, Casa de América, Ateneo de Madrid y Museo de América. I have also collaborated in round-table events at the Centro Nacional de Arte Museo Reina Sofía, Biblioteca Nacional, Museo Valenciano de la Ilustración y Ateneu barcelonés.

In the training area, I have been a founding member (2002) and coordinator (2004-2006) of the International Seminar of Young Researchers, based in the Institute of Philosophy, director of some postgraduate courses in the CSIC, and Honorary professor at the Universidad Autónoma de Madrid (2011-2013). Currently, I am professor in the PhD Programme of the Universidad Nacional de Educación a Distancia (UNED), and I have been advisor of numerous short and medium-length academic stays—from both visiting and JAE-intro scholars—and I am the supervisor of two PhD researches and co-supervisor of two others. Finally, I am expert adviser of the Spanish State Research Agency since 2017 and I have evaluated project researches for the CONICYT (Chile) and editorial projects for Springer publishing.
